Services Centre for the Disabled has made significant contribution and immeasurable progress with mission to alleviate poor economic condition and give solace to the under privilege by providing viable enterprises and free health care services.

SCD was set up in 1985 with an objective to empowering the lives of persons with disabilities and down trodden. The Organization's mission is to have a holistic approach to some of key developmental challenges areas of Health, Education and employment promotion. Since its inception by philanthropic efforts of the organization has ushered is a vast change in the livelihood of about 6, 34,150 lacs denizens of KBK Districts and encompassing 581 villages.

SCD collaborates with communities to identify their needs and involves them extensively in the decision process of transformational development.

The organization has worked with some of the most vulnerable and marginalized communities in KBK districts of Odisha, contributing to their integration into the mainstream development process of the country.

SCD Eye Hospital was established in 1998. It is located in Balangir district of Titilagarh Sub-Division, is a Charitable Non-Profit Hospital, Providing high quality comprehensive eye care services at affordable cost to local as well as patients from neighboring districts. In addition to base hospital, SCD has established eye care centre in other location to provide basic eye care facilities to the community. SCD currently has following network of eye care centre in under mentioned location.

❖ Kantabanji in Balangir District.

SCD Eye Hospital building was constructed with the financial and technical supported from CBM. Initially, it was established to provide eye care services to the people of Balangir district only but in the pursuit of growth and expansion with the support from CBM, relentless efforts and commitment put in, by its staff members and voluntary cooperation from the local community, it enable the SCD to serve people belonging to other remote places beyond Balangir district i.e. Kalahandi & Nuapada Districts.

## Board of Directors & Management Report

SCD has a board consisting of seven members. It has delegated a significant part of its tasks to Project Director, who implements as well as initiates the organization's policies. The project director manages and performs his duties according to a set of regulations describing the director's responsibilities and authority. The project director is accountable to the board.

The board approves the policies and annual plans and budgets that are prepared by the management and reviews them thoroughly. By doing so, the organization ensures that administrative and supervisory positions remain strictly segregated. Where necessary, the Project director will call on the expertise of board members to assist with implementation. The supervisory board of the SCD met four times in 2020.

## Eye Health

Cataract is the second leading cause of preventable blindness on the globe. Several programs across the country have been running efficiently to increase the cataract surgical rates and decrease blindness due to cataract. The current COVID-19 pandemic has led to a complete halt of these programs and thus accumulating all the elective cataract procedures.

India had been under lockdown for about 51 days .SCD closed down the surgery during the lockdown, cataract surgeries which had to be performed have been pending. It affected the entire achievement

## Outreach Eye Screening Camps

Community outreach programmes have been an integral part of SCD Eye Hospital from its inception i.e. 2000. For over 2 decades, the outreach eye camps have worked extremely well in identifying and surgically treating cataract patients in high volumes.

- Free eye screening camps are organized in remote rural and tribal villages in three districts (i.e. Balangir, Kalahandi and Nuapada) where, team from SCD goes for eye screening.
- Patients are screened for all kinds of eye problems.
- Preliminary treatment is provided on the spot and patients who need surgical treatment or detailed investigations are then transported back to the base hospital.
- The transported patients are then operated at SCD Eye Hospital by the latest and most sophisticated technology by skilled and expert team
- Expenditure for arrangement of stay, food and medicine are also borne by SCD Eye Hospital.
- Follow-up of these patients are done after seven days and final check-up after one month of surgery.
- The organization has organized over 66 eye camps till December 2020 and has screened over 15727 beneficiaries.

## School eye screening program

- SCD and the District administration Balangir, Odisha, organised an ophthalmic care drive named “Bal Jyoti” programme, where eye screening to be done to school children without any cost.
- The organisation conducting school eye screening program throughout the year, provide medical assistance and spectacles according to their need. The program is running with financial support of CBM as well as govt.
- Spanning five blocks (Saintala. Bangomunda, Titilagarh, Muribahal & Turekela) of Balangir district in BAL JYOTI programme.
- Preliminary screening of school students is absolutely free of cost in the school premises itself.
- The training of teachers is done for vision testing so that they may assist in the screening process.
- Students with diminished vision / other problems referred to the base hospital for further investigation and provision of spectacles.
- Following schools screening have done by SCD with the support of CBM.

SCD understand that establishing eye care services facility is not enough. Awareness on eye health is an important in comprehensive eye care service delivery. It can help in attracting patients and generating demand for services that is vital in eliminating avoidable blindness. Many factors act as barriers in people's attitude to seek eye services; awareness is a significant barrier to uptake of eye care services, especially in rural areas. People are unaware about the availability of the services and think they won't be able to pay for it. Some people are afraid of the surgery. SCD makes all efforts to make people overcome these barriers and access eye care services.

Therefore, SCD Eye Hospital has been creating awareness on comprehensive eye health services at community, Community leaders, Health Workers (ASHA, ANGANWADI), Local organizations, Clubs and etc, so the targeted groups can access the different eye care services available at our hospital. The Programme was facilitated by Project Director M.M.Das, Project Coordinator Amitabh Behera, Field Coordinator Sailendu ku. Nanda and Social worker Prashant Pattnaik.

Free pamphlet consisting information in Odia regarding cataract and its management were distributed to the ASHA, AGANWADI, PRI Members, Community Leaders, Patients and their relatives, also we are creating awareness through street play and advertise through leading News Paper.

Children with disabilities are more likely to miss out on school than other children. Even if they go to school, they are more likely to leave before finishing their primary education.

For children who are already marginalised, such as girls and children living in rural areas, a disability creates an additional barrier to accessing education.

In 1985 SCD has started a residential school for Children with Disability from 1<sup>st</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> standard having all facilities i.e. hostel for boys and girls. Educated and experienced teaching staffs for teaching the students. Till date many students have been passed out from the school and rehabilitated in various livelihood activities. Besides the school we work in the community for education of Children with disabilities

## LIVELIHOOD PROGRAMMES FOR THE PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

On dated 29/09/2020, Services Centre for the Disabled organized a Livelihood Program for the Persons with Disabilities named “**Financial Supported to Persons with Disabilities**” (Individual Micro Enterprise Plan) with the support of CBM. The Objective of this programme is identifying the potential of the persons with disabilities youth boys/girls and provide financial support (*without Interest*) to them, which could help them to start petty business and earn their livelihood without having to step out from their homes, make them financially independent. The beneficiaries will repay the amount within 24 small installments without any interest. The returned amount will be again distributed to other PWDs.
