

This year's the world sight them is "Love Yours Eyes" .Our eyes play important role in our life and vision impairment and eye-related issue can major disruption and discomfort in life.

Like all other parts of the world, the day is also being observed by Services Centre for the Disabled (S.C.D.) Eye Hospital, Titilagarh, Odisha and Lions Club, Titilagarh, Odisha jointly for Eye Health and undertaken different initiatives to raise awareness on vision impairments.

To address this concern, every year, SCD Eye Hospital has been planning and executing several of activities in the targeted area.

This year the following activities were done on this occasion

Awareness on eye care such as Cataract, Glaucoma, Diabetic Retinopathy, Refraction Error and other eye diseases in the Titilagarh town and nearby villages.

#### **Success Story**

#### Remove the cloud from Mrs. Gastri Malik eyes

#### **Background**

Mrs.Gastri Malik, 55 years old, W/o Late Malakeda Malik resides at Kursud of Kursud G.P of Titilagarh Block of Balangir District. Her family comprise of two members i.e. Son (Dhule Malik, Age-22 yrs) and herself. 2 years later she has got Biju Pacca Ghar. They have no cultivation land. Her son stay out of state (Raipur C.G.) for his livelihood, there he is working as a daily wage worker under a construction contractor. He is sending little money to his mother for meet her daily expenses .AlsoMrs. Gastri gets pension Rs 500/- and 10 KG rice per month from Govt. Odisha

Mrs. Gastri complained of low vision for over a year, gradually the vision became worse .she faced difficulty in her daily home cores as well as unable to go outside work. She did not participate in any cultural and social function.

Mrs. Gastri did not come to the hospital for eye check up due to fear and poor financial condition. The SCD's social worker and the villagers have been motivating her several times but she did not come to the hospital for surgery. Once she tried to come to the base hospital but she fell in sever fever.

#### Intervention by SCD Eye Hospital

On 03<sup>rd</sup> and 04<sup>th</sup> 12/2021, the evaluation team came to SCD for evaluation .On 04<sup>th</sup> /12/2021, Mr.Sailendu Nanda Field Coordinator, Mr.Prasanta Pattnaik, Social worker, Mr.Saumya Ranjan Grahacharya and Ms. Rajeshree Rout proceeded to Kursud for field visit, during the field visit the team identified Mrs. Gastri. About two hours struggle by the team and villagers Mrs. Gastri became ready and came with the team to base hospital for eye surgery.

The doctor had diagnosed her with cataract in both eyes, and had advised Mrs.Gastri to undergo surgery for the same. Soon after that, Mrs.Gastri underwent surgery.

Mrs.Gastri's Pre-Operative vision in **Right Eye Vision** was (PL+PR) and **Left Eye Vision** was (PL+PR) respectively. She got operated upon her **Right Eye** on 05/12/2021 and on the next day of surgery her Post –Operative **Right Eye Vision** was (**6/12**). After seven days on the first follow up her vision was improved to **6/9** 

The financial condition of Mrs.Gastri is poor, therefore the cataract surgery was done in **4134 MYP (VISION FOR ALL)** Scheme, supported by CBM. Which is enabled Mrs.Gastri to undergo cataract surgery free of cost at SCD Eye Hospital.

#### Life after Intervention by SCD Eye Hospital

This surgery enabled Mrs.Gastri to resume her day to day activities. She was very satisfied with the result. She showed the immense gratitude towards SCD Eye Hospital and staff, for the support rendered to her.

#### **Lesson Learned**

Still people are unaware about the good eye health practices and there is a fear of eye surgery. The poor financial condition is another burden for them. There for there is a need of eye awareness programme as well as outreach eye camp in the community.
